OUR IMPACT

ANNUAL GALA

This year, we organized and hosted the second edition of the Gufasha Girls Annual Gala on the 04th of October 2024 in Bbaale East Community, Kayunga district. This gala not different from the first uses sports as a tool of advocacy and aimed at bringing together different community stakeholders to work together to end child marriage, empower and support adolescent girls.

With the theme "The Power of Unity against Child Marriage" this year's gala emphasized that collective community action is necessary to dismantle harmful practices and create a safer, brighter future for girls everywhere. The Gufasha Girls Annual Gala brought together 1420 different stakeholders including local leaders, athletes, advocates for children's rights, students, adolescent girls, teachers, youth leaders, victims and survivors of child marriage, religious leaders, Health officers, cultural leaders and the Police.







GIRL EMPOWERMENT / SAFE SPACES

Through safe spaces, Gufasha Girls Foundation empowered and impacted 124 adolescent girls to become peer girls' rights educators, powerful leaders and change agents in their communities to stand against child marriage and all forms of violence among girls.

GENDER TRANSFORMATIVE EDUCA-TION ADVOCACY

We empowered 25 teachers with information, educational and communication materials to enable them to become powerful champions of girls' rights, to identify inequalities in classrooms, and develop strategies and responses to ensure they provide an education that challenges and transforms negative norms and attitudes that hold girls behind.



#SHE THRIVES EDUCATION SPON-SORSHIP PROGRAM.

This education sponsorship aims at providing education opportunities to girls who are at risk of violence and those whose families/backgrounds are unable to support their education. This year, the program has sponsored 20 girls between the age of 10 to 16 in Primary Schools.







"MY MENSTRUATION MY DIGNITY" PROGRAM.

The lack of access to sanitary products is one of the major challenges that many girls in the rural communities of Kayunga face. Through our program, 'My Menstruation is My Dignity,' we trained over 300 girls in 6 partner schools in June on how to make reusable pads using sewing machines, hand needles, cot-ton, and other materials. These Reusable pads have enabled girls to menstruate with pride and dignity and stay in school.

CHALLENGES FACED

Limited funding and resources, which made it difficult to scale our programs and provide long-term support to girls.

Poor school Infrastructures and gender biases, most of our partner schools lack proper and well equipped school systems that are responsive to the specific needs of girls, such as menstruation hygiene, sexual health education and safe spaces for girls to express themselves.

Weak enforcement of laws, which continued to make legal protection of girls from child marriage less effective.

Deep-rooted traditions and widespread myths and misinformation about marriage, girls' education, and sexual health have continued to perpetuate child marriage.

FUTURE PROSPECTS

In 2025 and beyond, we look forward to engaging, involving and impacting as many girls and communities as possible and provide comprehensive support services including access to education, healthcare, safe spaces, leadership trainings, vocational trainings, financial literacy, and mentorship to empower them to make informed decisions for their lives, futures, become powerful agents of change and form strategic partnerships and joint initiatives with different stakeholders.
